Gold Key awards annual scholarship



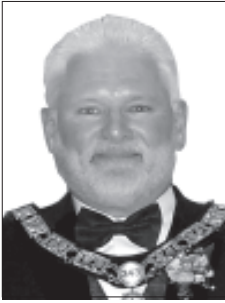

What is the Gold Key? This is a scholarship given to special needs seniors that would like to further their education. This scholarship is for \$2000 a year and is renewable for up to 3 years. The students are usually from families that make less than \$20,000 and because of their special needs, they do not have the grades to qualify for other scholarships. These students do not have to attend major colleges.

In the last 5 years Lodge 343 has successfully applied for 11 such scholarships. Of these 11, 10 have completed their studies. The one student moved to Florida and found a job working with his brother. How do we pay for these? We have fundraisers throughout the state, one of which has been held at Lodge 343 for the past 23 years. This year we will have a golf outing on August 11th. 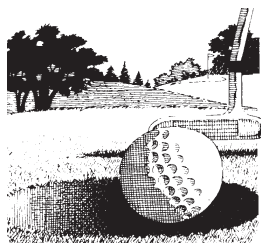

Sunday, July 8th – the CurePSP Memorial Golf Scramble Outing – 8:30 a.m. shotgun start (\$75 includes golf, cart, continental breakfast, and lunch) Hosted by Terri Bartley, her sister Cindy MacDonald, Kay McGuigan and her brother Dave Crimmins, who lost their moms to PSP.

You may ask – what is PSP? It is progressive supranuclear palsy, a neurodegenerative brain disease that has no known cause, treatment or cure. It affects nerve cells that control walking, balance, mobility, vision, speech, and swallowing. Five to six people per 100,000 will develop PSP. Because it is so rare – only about 1% as common as Parkinson's disease - it is often misdiagnosed. Approximately 4,500 people in the United States have PSP. Terri & Cindy's mother, and Kay & Dave's mother are the only two cases in St. Clair County (that we are aware of) and because of its rarity, they were diagnosed with the disease in other states.

The Golf Outing is to raise awareness and funds for further research on this debilitating, cruel disease. Famous actor Dudley Moore also died of PSP.

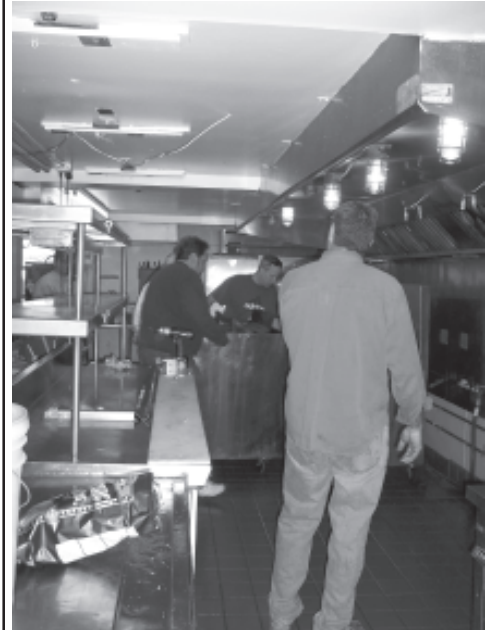
